Fraud Isn't Always Obvious: Sneaky Spring Scams

Spring is a season of fresh starts – unfortunately, scammers know that, too. As we head into warmer weather, busy travel schedules, and tax season deadlines, fraudsters ramp up their tactics and rely on one thing: catching people off guard. A little awareness goes a long way. Here are a few of the most common (and convincing) scams, plus simple ways to protect yourself.

AI “Voice Cloning” & Family Emergency Scams

Yes, it can sound exactly like them.

Imagine answering the phone and hearing a loved one say: “Grandma, I’m in trouble. I need money right now.” The voice sounds real. They may even use your name. Scammers can even use artificial intelligence to mimic voices with only a few seconds of audio, often pulled from social media videos, voicemails, or public recordings.

Red flags to watch for:

A sudden emergency with intense pressure to act fast
A request to wire money, send gift cards, or transfer funds immediately
“Don’t tell anyone,” secrecy, or emotional manipulation

Protect yourself with these simple habits:

- Pause before you react. Scammers count on panic.
- Hang up and call back using the number you normally use, not the number that called you.
- Set up a family password. Choose a simple phrase only your family knows, and use it to verify real emergencies.

Fake Delivery Texts & “Package Problem” Messages

This one is a classic go-to for scammers.

If you’ve ever received a text or email saying a package is delayed, needs extra postage, or can’t be delivered until you “confirm your information,” you’re not alone. These messages are designed to look official, and they’re counting on curiosity and convenience to get you to click.

Common versions you might see:

- “Your package is on hold – click to reschedule delivery.”
- “USPS/UPS: address verification needed.”
- “Pay a small fee to release your shipment.”

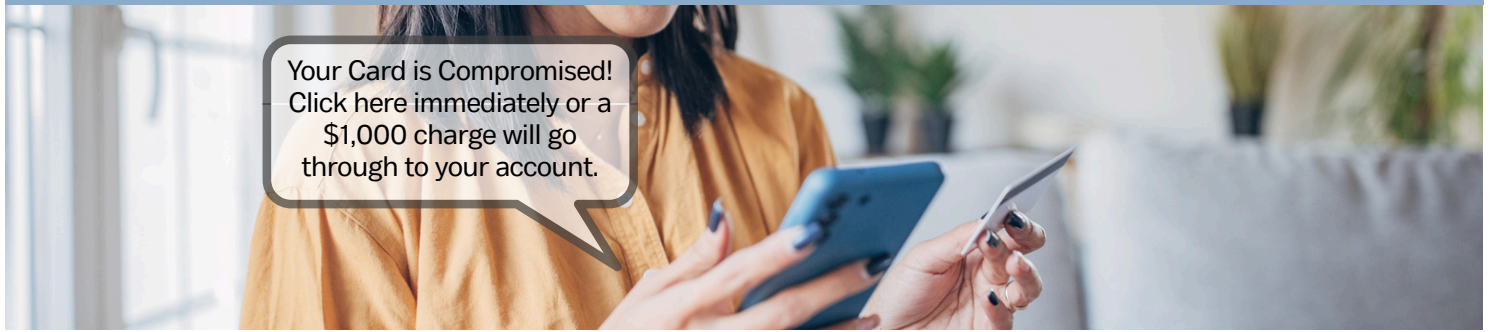

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How to spot the scam:

- The email or web address looks unusual or misspelled
- The message feels urgent or threatening
- The message pushes you to click a link and enter personal or banking information

What to do instead:

Don't click. Delete the message.

If expecting a delivery, go directly to the shipper's official website (by typing it into your browser) or use the tracking number you already have.

Tax Season Scams

During tax season, scammers often pretend to be the IRS, a tax preparer, or even a company offering "refund help." They may use fear ("You owe and will be arrested") or excitement ("You qualify for a big refund!") to get information.

Watch for:

- Demands of immediate payment
- Requests to pay by gift card, wire transfer, or app-based payment
- Requests to "verify" your personal information

Safer steps:

If unsure, hang up and contact the organization using a trusted number you find independently (not the number provided in the message).

Never share passwords, PINs, or one-time codes with someone who contacted you unexpectedly.

Spring Travel Scams & Card Safety Tips

Spring getaways are exciting, and scammers know many people are booking hotels, paying deposits, or traveling out of state. This can open the door to fake booking sites, suspicious listings, and higher risk of card theft.

A few smart travel reminders:

- Be cautious with ATMs - use well-lit locations connected to a bank.
- Watch for fake vacation listings or suspicious booking websites; verify and book stays through trusted sources.
- Don't overshare travel plans online (it can also make your home a target).

Pro tip: Let us know before you go.

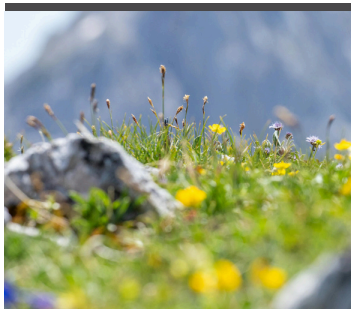

Hang up and don't engage further.
